## **Sixty years! What a milestone for a club to achieve.**

Perranporth Surf Life Saving Club was formed in February 1957. It was in response to a number of drownings on the beach the previous summer. Dr Douglas Robb arranged the inaugural meeting and a small band of founding members came forward:-

Harold Oakes (Capt), Cyril Kent (vCapt), John Heath (Treas), Walter Plimley (Sec), Jed Wilkinson, Ted Rilstone, John Roberts, Ray Jones, Tony Blackman, Pete Gill and Alan Homes (the club grom).

Alan Homes is still a club member today and some of the other names are recognisable within the club or certainly have family links back to the founders. I am sure they would all be proud to see how the club has grown and that their early endeavours to save lives on Perranporth beach has continued for sixty years.

Another of our former club members past away this year. Mike Harding was from Truro and joined the club in 1967. Mike was the club gear steward through the 1970s. Mike emigrated with his wife Hilary to Australia in 1980. They both went on to become founding members of Sunshine Beach SLSC in Noosa, Queensland. The Perranporth Old Boy's surfboat crew laid Mike's ashes to rest off Tubbys Hd, St Agnes on the 5th July 2017.

Over the sixty year period the membership and the club premises has grown out of all recognition. Today the club is bursting at the seams with equipment and membership numbers. Growing to such an extent that there is a waiting list for those wanting to join the nipper (7-12yrs) category.

There are training nights on every day of the week during the summer months. Catering for the nippers, the youth, seniors and the very successful ladies evening. Several of older youth members are employed with the RNLI, either in a professional lifeguard capacity or acting as lifeguard volunteers.

Fund raising is an ongoing challenge and the club management committee leave no stone unturned in their drive to secure additional funds to bolster the annual club membership fees.

The club held a sixtieth summer ball in June. Attended by past and present members and their families. Old photos were poured over and discussed and the stories became longer and more exaggerated as the evening wore on. To celebrate sixty years of club history within the small community of Perranporth is no mean achievement and everyone should be very proud of what the past and the present club members have achieved.

Congratulations to all those who made it to the sixtieth year. To those who have left their mark upon Perranporth Surf Life Saving Club, we thank you for all your support, enthusiasm and the memories.

**This year we are proud to say that there has been a Surf Life Saving Club on Perranporth beach for 60 years and still showing full commitment to the local community. The club always pulls together and this showed when the 60th celebrations happened and we had to change everything in a few days and had one of the best evenings I can remember. In my mind to list all the achievements over the year would just take too much time, so I would like to thank all the members of the club for all their time making the club such a great place to be.**

This year we have seen a far more members committed to becoming Trainers and Coaches which can only help the club achieve its aim and purpose. This year I have been more involved in the training and our standards are as high as normal which always makes me believe that our Professional Guards are well equipped for anything the public can throw at them.

Over the last few years we have moved away from one of our key activates which was our Voluntary Patrols as we were finding it hard to get the commitment and having the correct insurance to cover the club. This year we were one of the pilot clubs to start out-of-hours patrols. This is moving away from the normal idea of Patrolling and having to setup Red and Yellow flags and commit to 4/5 hours at a time.

The new frameworks will Team Type the patrol which is being declared at the time.

I hope next year through continuous training, it will become a pleasure to examine our club members. We do have to be always ready to save lives and that needs practice and commitment from all.

## RNLI

**Even before the season got going this year we had a few problems with vandalism to the rear store. This has since been replaced with a much more secure shipping container that sits up neatly with the club one and against the main building. The medical room and entrance hallway were also given improvement works and prepared for the 2017 season.**

This year we have seen record numbers of our members securing employment with the RNLI. Joining the ranks this year were former clubbie and Australian Lifeguard Samson Marsh and local Max Lawrence, both stationed

at Perran Sands. Also Rory Tellam progressed from a volunteer role to that of a Peak Season Perranporth Lifeguard and his brother Samson Tellam was relocated from working the Lizard beaches to Perran Sands. This is great to see and I am really glad that our club is able to prepare our youth for working with the RNLI where they have the opportunity to further develop their lifeguarding skills and hopefully then put these back into the club themselves.

Anyone interested in working or volunteering for the RNLI in 2018 can get an application submitted in the New



Year. Follow the advertisement for applications on the RNLI website and speak to Ben.

The RNLI has undergone major restructuring this year to help better facilitate management of the beaches. Managers now cover a specific area and all RNLI assets within that area. Perranporth is now part of 'Portreath to Holywell' and is under a manager responsible for our area, the Newquay area and the lifeboats on the Isles of Scilly, St Agnes and Newquay. This greatly enhances our ability to work jointly and this year we did more than ever.

The French shipwreck Le Seine has again made appearances at the low tide mark, but much less so than in 2016. However I would still encourage all members to spread the word about the location and dangers that it can pose to clubbies, surfers and tourists.

Training with other agencies is essential for Lifeguards and as well as talks with dementia specialists, wildlife experts, Lifeboat visits and Police talks lifeguards are prepared to undertake multiagency response. On the first day of Main Season when Perran Sands opened for the first time, the Lifeguards had a major search for a possible venerable member of the public which saw a Police Helicopter, Coastguard, Police Dog Handler and Lifeboat tasked to conduct a search. This went smoothly and with a positive result.



In September continuing into October we had a rare event occur. Well reported in the news were the Portuguese Man O War, which Lifeguards did their best to collect and dispose of daily while advising the public

Occurring from time to time, we also helped an Adder who had found itself at Flat Rocks back up into the dunes. IRB Captain Rob Farr continues with delivery of club IRB training, with myself stepping in to assess the candidates again this year during October.

The Club sent three IRBs and club boardpaddles to support the RNLI fundraiser Caste to Castle, with the RNLI then supporting the Club with the Triathlon with a Jet Ski and IRBs, board paddlers and tube swimmers, both major fundraising events for both organisations. I hope we can continue to support each other in 2018 on such a good level.

we were in the Caribbean that day. In July Perranporth Carnival meant our Nippers were able to get creative with some super colourful and fun sea creature and recycling costumes on show. I think some of the parents had more fun than the children with the dressing up, and we won for our efforts.

I just want to say an enormous 'thank you' to all the parents and friends who help make Nippers so special by giving their precious time to help with sessions, entertaining and fundraising. 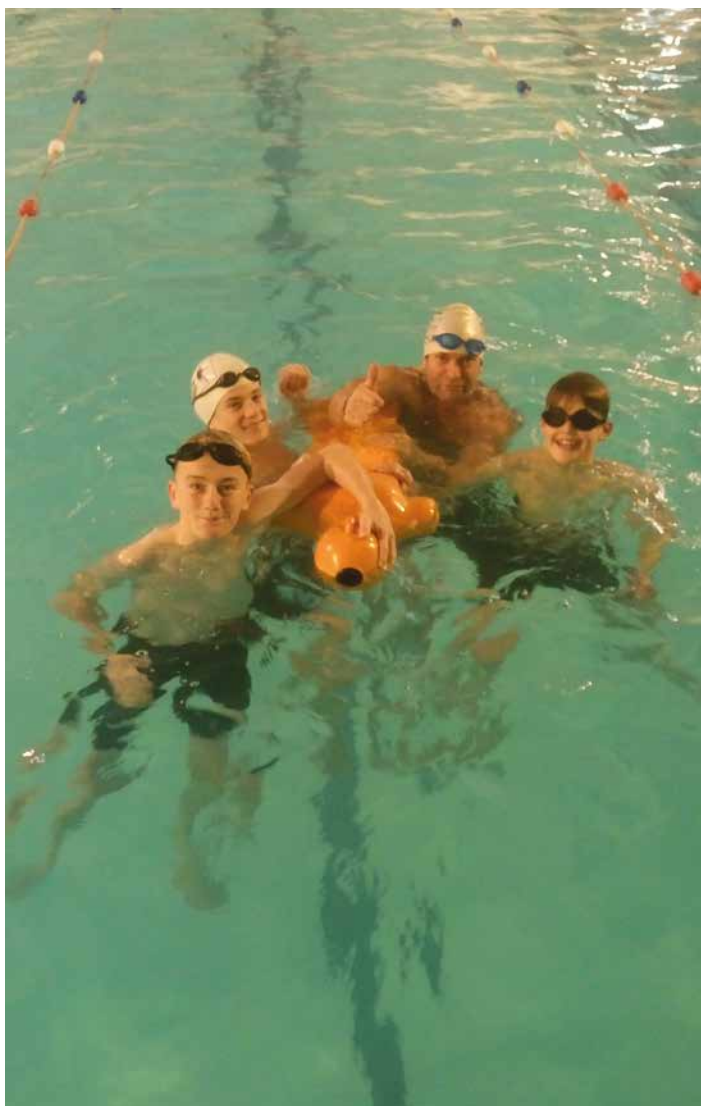

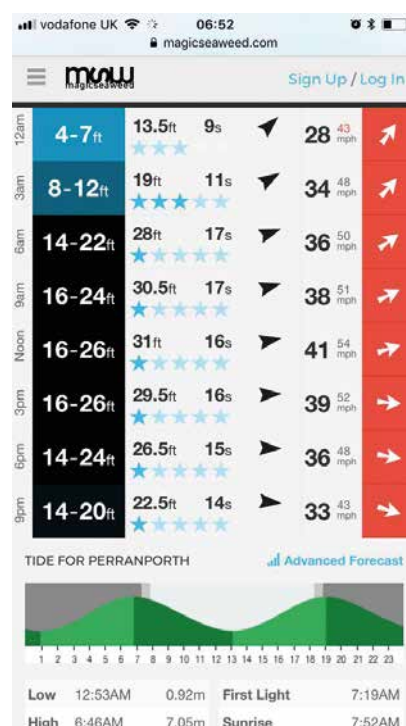

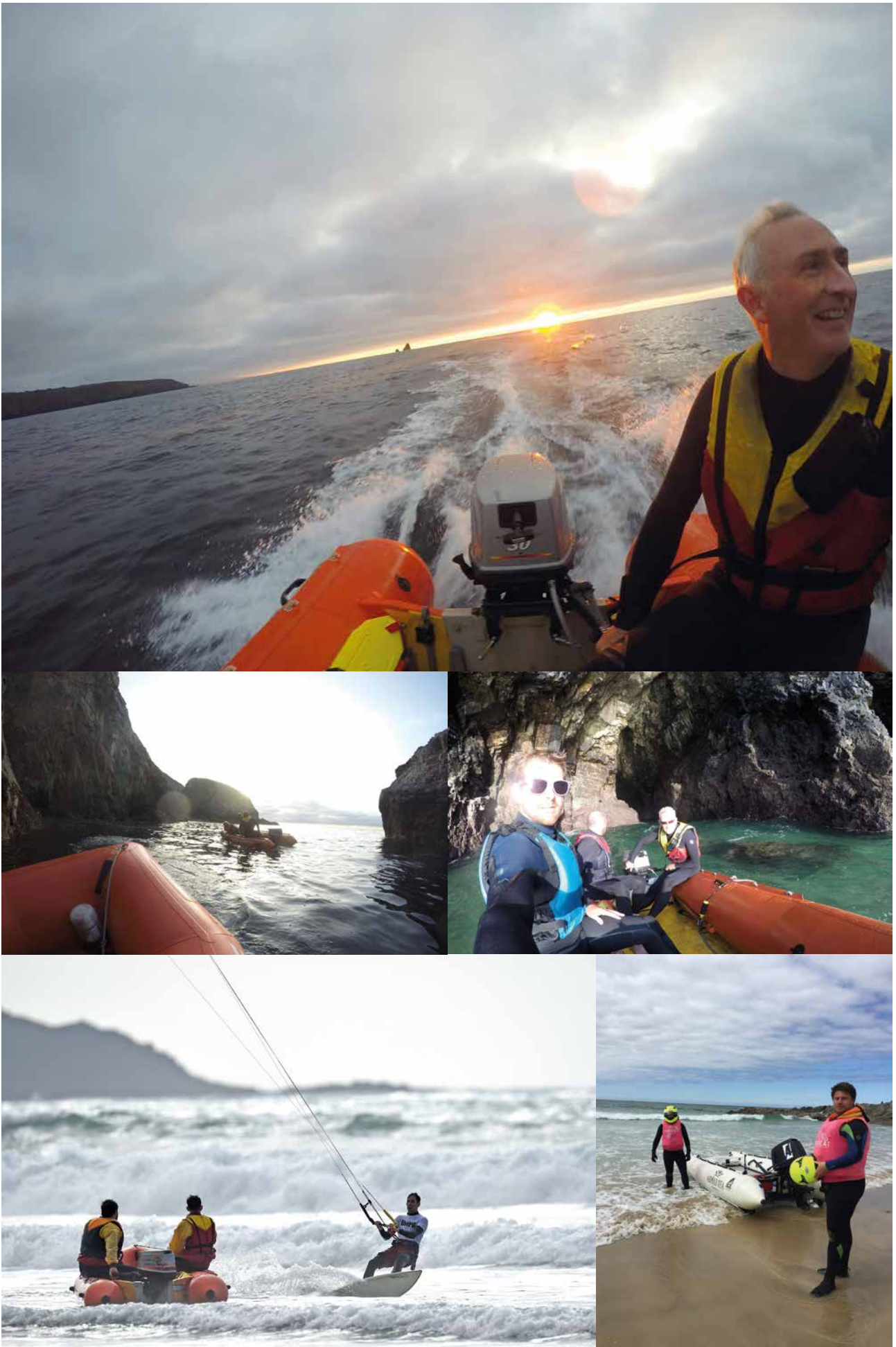

# PERRANPORTH EXTREME SURF TRIATHLON & YOUTH CHALLENGE AQUATHON 2017

Our 10th Youth Aquathon had fewer overall entries this year but noticeably there were many more 13 -16 year olds competing, which was great to see as these ages have always been sparse. The race attracts swimmers and surf lifesaving children aged 7 - 16 from Cornwall and beyond. The children had great sea conditions and lovely sunshine this year for a change and there was a fabulous vibe on the Inner Green throughout the day. The beach was busy with holidaymakers who did not have a clue as to why all these fit children were running past! All of the children were superb in attitude and performance in all of the distances and a credit to their parents and clubs.

We were excited to put on our world famous Triathlon once more and this year celebrated the event's 30th anniversary. We had record entries for this fundraising weekend; we also had willpower-trying weather and surf as well! A big thank you must go to the volunteer marshals and set up/take down teams who worked tirelessly and cheerfully in torrential rain for the duration of the race. We received many plaudits from competitors after the weekend to say how encouraging the marshals were to them as they raced the course, despite standing soggy in their positions.

Knuckle biting 6ft surf conditions truly tested the competitors in the 1.5k swim but thanks to Ben Gardiner and David Meads who brought together the combined

forces of the Club and RNLI lifeguards, our water safety team stepped up magnificently to provide top class cover in this section of the race and only 20 people were pulled out. The 38k cycle course was also a worry with the amount of rain and standing water making the route and the steep Cocks Hill section particularly treacherous. The 7.5k beach and cliff run was soggy, slippery and hard after the excitement of the swim and bike and even the overall male and female winners Neil Eddy and Fenella Langridge, both GB triathletes commented on the toughness of this year's race. The Watering Hole was steaming with hungry, wet and cold competitors for the post-race meal and presentation!

The weather could have been kinder for us but what stood out was the amazing team spirit of the event team and the volunteer marshals, who with their stoic and positive attitude in such foul weather made the day so memorable. Without our club members and the community of Perranporth this event does not happen and we are eternally grateful for their help each year. Looking forward to 2018!
